- 545 different species identified




Noteworthy Cases and other 'goings on'

- Received material from the Jeju Air crash in Korea to confirm the bird identification
- Assisted with 5 NTSB cases
- Specimen exchange with Italian museum to improve our European holdings
- Hosted Bahrain Airport Company, wildlife manager for overview of Feather ID Lab



Birdstrike collection - Whole/partial carcass



- Pluck a variety of feathers including
 - wing, tail, breast, back, any feathers with color or pattern
- Do not cut feathers
- Limit amount of 'chunks' of tissue
- Don't send entire/partial carcass
- Take a photo

Birdstrike collection - Snarge/blood smear



- Wipe/Scrape off all snarge
- Use alcohol
 - Never use water, bleach, or cleansers
- Include feathers, if available
- Limit amount of 'chunks' of tissue

- -Let sample dry before sealing in a bag.
- -If extremely damaging or high profile strike, collect all available evidence.
- -Each impact point on an aircraft and each carcass should be treated as a separate sample.


